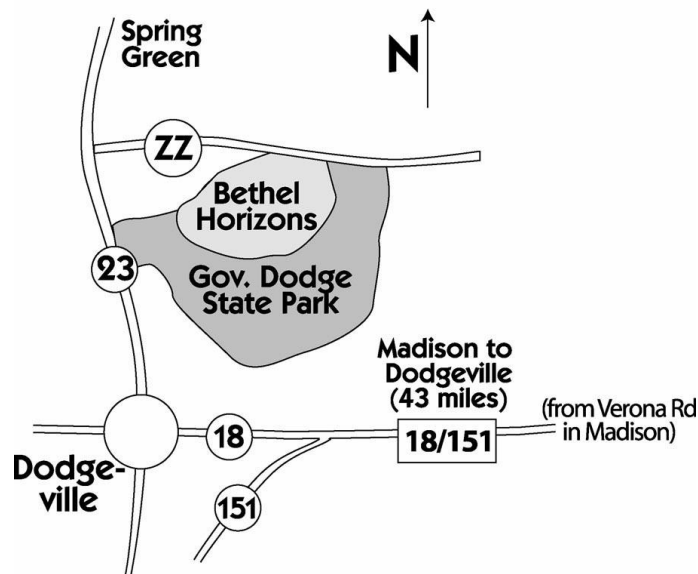
The following document will give general information about the Adamah Art Studio at Bethel Horizons, our policies, important contact information and what you need to know before you participate in one of our workshops.

Directions:

From Madison, take Highway 18-151 West to the Dodgeville exit, Hwy 18. In Dodgeville, take a right onto Highway 23 and drive approximately 7 miles North (passing Governor Dodge State Park on your right). Take a right onto County Highway ZZ and drive 1.2 miles to the entrance to the Adamah Art Studio (right side of the road). We are one driveway past the main Bethel Horizons entrance. Parking is available down the drive and to your right by the Art Ventures Retreat Center (AVRC).

Arrival/Check-in:

Upon arrival, please check in with Jennifer Mally, Director. At the beginning of a workshop, Jennifer is often facilitating both the studio and the retreat center. If you cannot physically find her, please text her at 608-574-8100. If you are here for a multi-day workshop and will be lodging at the retreat center, go to the retreat center first, find your assigned room and get settled in. Jennifer will be available to help you with any needs you have.

Art Retreat Center (ARC)

The ARC is located on the art campus to the right of the main Adamah Studio. The retreat center's 17 lodging rooms are located down the hallway to the left of the dining hall. Your name will be posted on your room door. Often, we will post a workshop schedule on the cork board outside your door. Any general announcements will be posted on the white board at the entrance of the retreat center.

Each room has three double beds and a private bathroom. We assign three same-sex adults to each room unless other requests are made with the director. For Adamah workshops the retreat center provides sheets, pillows and towels in each room. We do not provide shampoo or bar soap. Each room has an individual heater/air conditioner. There are check-out instructions on the back of each door.

Participants have 24-hour access to coffee and tea as well as to our water and ice machine. You are free to store personal food items in the dining hall refrigerator and heat food in the microwave.

The retreat center's first aid kit, defibrillator and emergency exit strategy are located near the main entrance.

WI-FI:

The Adamah Art Campus has internet service with restrictions. The internet password will be provided but NO STREAMING or DOWNLOADING is allowed. If the staff is experiencing problems using the internet due to too many people taxing the band width, the director reserves the right to turn off the public access to the internet., allowing the staff to work.

Meals:

When meals are provided during a workshop, they will be served in the main dining hall of the ARC. The typical meal schedule is as follows:

Breakfast: 7:30am

Brunch: (if scheduled) 11:00

Lunch: 12:00 noon

Dinner: 6:00pm

Please contact Mike with any special diets or food allergies. We do not typically serve vegetarian, vegan, gluten or dairy free meals unless we are notified beforehand.

Adamah Studio:

Adamah Studio is our main, four-season studio located directly in front of you as you enter the main Adamah driveway. The bathrooms and studio kitchen are located in this building.

Scotties Studio:

The Scotties Studio is the first building to your left as you enter the main Adamah driveway. Scotties is our open-air, summer studio with electricity and water, but no heat.

Suggested participant packing list:

- Water bottle
- Personal toiletries (soap, shampoo, etc)
- Watch/Alarm Clock
- Sweater/sweatshirt and warm jacket (nights can get surprisingly chilly!)
- Rain gear
- Sturdy footwear/Hiking shoes
- Flashlight/headlamp
- Snacks, drinks (alcoholic drinks are allowed for people 21 years old and older)
- Optional but often useful: A sketchbook, camera, reading material, Frisbee, binoculars, etc

Animals

Participants and visitors are prohibited from bringing live pets to camp. The exception is certified working service animals.

Weapons

Weapons are not allowed anywhere on the Adamah Art Campus

Alcohol Policy:

For retreat groups and workshop participants, alcohol is allowed in the retreat centers and the Adamah Studio.

*Illegal substances are not allowed at Bethel Horizons. In the case so of a minor, should a violation occur, a parent/guardian will be notified.

Participants under 18 years of age:

Adamah Art Studio requires participants under 18 years of age to submit a Health Care Form before they attend a workshop. The health care form is available as a pdf on the Adamah website: www.adamahartstudio.org
